## **Fabric Requirements & Cutting Instructions**

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

(A)	1201 Reflections 78 Olive Rust	Fat Quarter	• Fussy cut one 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " as shown in quilt photo.
(B)	1203 Pirouette 31 Gold	⅓ yard	<ul> <li>Cut one 2" x 42" strip. Sub-cut the strip into two 2" x 15 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut one 2" x 42" strip. Sub-cut the strip into two 2" x 18 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut four 1 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut the strips into two 1 ½" x 40 ½" strips and two 1 ½" x 42 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
(C)	1204 Diamond Block 55 Blue	1 yard	<ul> <li>Cut four 2 ½" x WOF strips.</li> <li>Cut two 2 ½" x 36 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut two 2 ½" x 40 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut one 11" x 42" strip. Sub-cut the strip into two 11" squares. Cut the squares across one diagonal to make four triangles.</li> </ul>
(D)	1203 Pirouette 11 Rust	⅓ yard	• Cut one 2 ½" WOF strip.
(E)	1205 Princess Cut 55 Blue	⅓ yard	• Cut one 2 ½" WOF strip.
(F)	1202 Fragments 78 Olive Rust	1 ¾ yards	<ul> <li>Cut four 7" x 56" strips from the length of fabric (LOF).</li> <li>Cut six 2 ½" x 42" strips from the LOF.</li> </ul>
(G)	1203 Pirouette 55 Blue	½ yard	• Cut two 3 ½" x 30 ½" strips. • Cut two 3 ½" x 36 ½" strips.
(H)	Black	½ yard	• Cut six 2 ½" x WOF strips.
Back	ing (Your Choice)	3 ½ yards	• Cut two 61" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make the 61" x 61" back.

#### You will also need:

<sup>• 61&</sup>quot; x 61" Batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

## **Block Assembly Instructions**

- **1.** Sew one 2" x 15 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 15 ½" Fabric A square. Sew one 2" x 18 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A square to complete the center block (Fig. 1).
- 2. Sew one 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strip to each side of one 2 ½" x 42" (LOF) Fabric F strip to make one C/F/C strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second strip. Sub-cut the strips to make thirty-two 2 ½" x 6 ½" C/F/C units (Fig. 3).





- 3. Sew one 2 ½" x 42" (LOF) Fabric F strip to each side of one 2 ½" x WOF Fabric E strip to make one F/E/F strip. Sub-cut the strip into eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" F/E/F units (Fig. 4).
- **4.** Sew two C/F/C units and one F/E/F unit together to make one 9-patch Block One (Fig. 5). Repeat to make eight Block Ones total.
- **5.** Sew one 2 ½" x 42" (LOF) Fabric F strip to each side of one 2 ½" x WOF Fabric D strip to make one F/D/F strip. Sub-cut the strip into eight 2 ½" x 6 ½" F/D/F units (Fig. 6).




**6.** Sew two C/F/C units and one F/D/F unit together to make one 9-patch Block Two (Fig. 7). Repeat to make eight Block Twos total.



- **7.** Sew two Block Twos and one Block One together to make one side border. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew the two borders to the center block (Fig. 8).
- **8.** Sew two Block Ones and two Block Twos together to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the center block (Fig. 8).
- 9. Sew one  $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $30 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of the center block. Sew one  $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $36 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top (Fig 9).
- **10.** Sew one 2 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the center block. Sew one 2 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the center block (Fig. 10).



- **11.** Sew one 1 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the center block. Sew one 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the center block (Fig. 11).
- **12.** Using your ruler cut the corner of the center block off, going ¼" above the center of upper left square of the 9-patch block. Repeat this with the other three corners of the center block (Fig. 12).
- **13.** Sew one Fabric C triangle to the Fabric B strip of each side of the center block (Fig. 13).



### **Quilt Top Assembly Instructions**

- **14.** Center one 7" x 56" Fabric F strip on one side of the quilt top and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the quilt top and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- **15.** Repeat Step 16 to sew one 7" x 56" Fabric F strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the quilt top. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 14).
- **16.** Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 14) draw a 45° line out to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Repeat this step with remaining corners (Fig. 15).
- 17. Layer and quilt as desired.
- **18.** Sew the six 2-1/2 x 42" binding strips together end-to-end with 45° seams to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 19. Bind as desired.




